HDMI 4-Play Extender Kit 500456

Quick Installation Guide

Overview

The HDMI 4-Play Extender Kit (500456) allows HDMI equipment to be connected up to 330 ft (100 m) @ 1080p Deep Color via one (1) Cat 5e/6 unshielded twisted pair cables in a point-to-point configuration. The product also features one LAN port for interconnecting Ethernet equipment and a RS-232 port for control via the same Cat5e/6 cable. The kit comes with one (1) Transmitter and one (1) Receiver as well as an IR Emitter and IR Sensor for remote control applications.

Applications

Applications include commercial and residential AV systems, classroom projector systems, digital signage, boardroom systems, collaborative PC systems, and medical information systems.

Installation

1. Identify the connectors on the Transmitter and Receiver as indicated on the product labels.






- 2. Verify that the distance between the HDMI Transmitter and Receiver is within MuxLab specifications (see Specifications table).
- 3. To install the Transmitter:
 - 3a. Connect the Transmitter to the HDMI video source with an HDMI compliant cable.
 - 3b. Connect one (1) lengths of Cat 5e/6 (or higher) grade UTP cables to RJ45 LINK connectors on the Transmitter.

To install the Receiver:

- 4a. Connect the Receiver to the HDMI display equipment with an HDMI compliant cable.
- 4b. Connect the one (1) Cat 5e/6 cables to RJ45 LINK connectors on the Receiver.
- 4. Connect the 5 VDC power supply to the Receiver first, and then plug the power supply into an AC power outlet. Connect the 5 VDC power supply to the Transmitter first, and then plug the power supply into an AC power outlet. If power is present, the green power LED of the Transmitter and the Receiver will be ON.

Note: Power the HDMI 4-Play Extender only after all connections are made.

- Power the HDMI equipment and verify the image quality.
- This product support bidirectional IR control. If infrared remote control is needed to control
 the Source equipment from the Display, connect the IR Sensor to the 3.5mm Stereo Jack of
 the receiver and the IR Emitter to the 3.5mm Mono Jack of the Transmitter.
 - Note: You can differentiate the IR Sensor and the IR Emitter by looking at the 3.5 mm plug. The IR Sensor is using a Stereo Plug (3 Contacts) and the IR Emitter a mono plug (2 Contacts). Do not mix emitters and sensors from this kit with older versions.
- Position the IR Sensor so that it is directed to the hand-held remote control. For a clear IR signal reception, aim the hand-held remote control to the top of the IR Sensor enclosure.
- 8. Position the IR Emitter as close as possible to the source's IR Sensor (i.e. DVD player). For a clear IR signal reception, the IR Emitter can be glued on the source's IR Sensor. The IR Emitter's signal is transmitted from the side of the enclosure.
- If infrared remote control is needed to control the Display equipment from the Source, connect the IR Emitter to the 3.5mm Stereo Jack of the receiver and the IR Sensor to the 3.5mm Mono Jack of the Transmitter.
- If an Ethernet 10/100 LAN connection is required, connect Cat5e/6 jumper cables between the LAN equipment and the RJ45 LAN connectors on the Transmitter and Receiver.
- 11. If a serial communication is required, the product also supports RS232 pass-thru in order to allow a device such as commercial monitors to be controlled as in digital signage application. Please refer to the following diagram for the cabling connection.
- 12. The following diagram shows the final configuration.
